1. Stoplight behavior clips
2. Reward beads are given for positive behavior.
3. Warnings are given for undesirable behavior.
4. If warnings do not work, clips are then moved.
5. Time out for a desired activity will then be enforced and beads removed.
6. A behavioral plan will then be put into place.

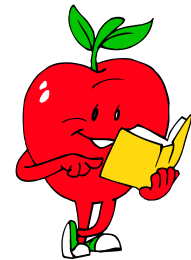
## Cobb School Philosophy
